We pray for peace in the world and for conversion of sinners.

First Joyful Mystery The Annunciation

The Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to tell her she would be the Mother of the Son of God. Mary declared herself to be the handmaid of the Lord. An Angel also appeared to Joseph, telling him not to be afraid to accept Mary as his wife.

This was the beginning of the Holy Family, but it was a rocky and dangerous beginning—travel to Bethlehem in late pregnancy, birth in a cave that was a stable, later fleeing to Egypt to escape the wrath of Herod, returning much later to Nazareth where Jesus could grow up in relative safety and obscurity, and then just the day-to-day life in that small town. Mary and Joseph answered the call of the angel in spite of the difficulties and dangers they encountered.

Lord, we know that many families today are suffering from the stress for more than a year due to the pandemic, grief for family members who have died, loss of jobs and income. There are many families in which members are estranged from each other, sometimes for months and even many years. The pandemic has only heightened the sorrow and made it more difficult for families to reconcile. Your Mother, Our Lady of Fatima, asked us to pray for the renewal of Christian family life and peace in the world. May we take her message to heart, proclaim God's love for families, knowing that peace in our families can lead to peace in the world. Let us be true servants of the Lord, and may Our Lady of Fatima bless in our work.

She gave birth to her first born* son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them at the inn.

In that region there were shepherds out in the field keeping watch over their flock at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear, but the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for behold, I proclaim to you good news of great joy that will be for all the people. For today in the city of David a savior has been born for you who is Messiah and Lord."
